




DESIGN STORY "TRAIBHU-MIKATHA"

Our design narrative unveils the essence of 'Thai-ness' by retelling the ancient Thai epic. "Traibhumikatha,' harmonizing three realms: Underwater World, Human World, and Heaven. The resort, divided into beach and mountain sides, intricately weaves the saga of these worlds. The beach side mirrors the Underwater World, where the Naga, the sea serpent, embarks on a journey from the sea, winding through the beachside pool and an underground tunnel to reach Phasutha Building Human World, home to the main lobby.

Transitioning through the Human World, guests encounter the Crystal Kingdom, housing the Lagoon Villas, reflecting the sky's mosaic wall. The path leads to Heaven or Sawan Pavilion, the zenith of the three realms. The pavilion, surrounded by a lotus pond, embodies the sacred ocean, with the sky's reflection and mosaic walls echoing the Thai belief of heavenly floating. ART SCULPTURES UNVEILED

Kuan-Ka-Sian-Samut Collection

Kuan-Ka-Sian-Samut is a collection of important events in Thai Ramayana literature that caused conflicts between angels and giants in the manifestation of immortal water.

1. Unity

A ceremony which uses wood from Mantarakeri mountain to stir the ocean of milk including the moon, the Erawan white elephant, and Parichat Tree

2. Title of Heaven

The blue colours of the sea combined with the design of the "Sati". The patterns are incorporated from Thai art and the flower "Montharop" or heaven's flower.

3. Va-Su-Kri - The King of Nagas

"Naga," the serpent king and largest snake in the world, is also known as "Va-Su-Kri" in Hindu and Buddhist mythology.

4. Aup-Sorn-Sawan - Angel

An angel named Aup-Sorn-Sawan, a positive force born during the Kuan-Ka-Sian-Samut ceremony featured in Unity. Green is the colour of the heavens. The triangular shape represents the mountain and pine trees of the resort while complementing the blue colour of the sea and the skies.

5. Wa-Ru-Nee - Queen of Pleasantness

Wa-Ru-Nee, the Queen of Pleasantness, is one of the fourteen wonderful beings born from the Kuan-Ka-Sian-Samut ceremony.

FLOWERS



Plumeria (ลักวศั) In Southeast Asia the plumeria tree and flower are considered sacred.



Indian Head Ginger (бонновон) In Dominican folk medicine, an herbal tea made from the leaves of C. spicatus is used for diabetes.





Dracaena (หมากผู้หมากเห็น) One of the most effective houseplants in air purification.



Areca Palm (numnwo) The plants help in absorbing indoor air pollutants.



Nelumbo Nucifera (นิวหลอง) The lotus symbolizes Buddhism's cultural and spiritual signifi-



Bush Clock Vine (800000) A herbaceous perennial climbing plant species in the genus Thunbergia native to western Africa.



Rubescens (strictionsins)
A belief plant is a popular type of loving-kindness herb, and herbs to enhance luck and fortune



Ruffled Fan Palm (tháusu) A single trunked shorter species of palm. Glossy green, undivided, pleated, round leaves give the impression of a large folded fan.



Claw (#\$penn#) are known to those who grow them as a host flower to many birds, especially the hummingbird.

Spider Lily (w@ow\$ang) The bulb is emetic and expectorant, a decoction is used to counteract poison, ulcers and swellings.



Beach Naupaka (8nn:18) Scaevola taccada is used to prevent coastal crosion as well as for landscaping.



Fiddle-Leaf Fig (Instutio) This air purifying plant makes for great Feng Shui in your home.



Indian Cork

(0u)
A typical narraw tree with frarant flowers that bloom straight out and then later hang down, the bark can be used like cork.



White Champaka (\$70) A large evergreen tree in the family Magnoliaceae. It is known for its fragrant flowers, and its timber

used in woodworking.



Florida Fiddlewood (upontris) A very pretty shrub with its tiny fragrant flowers blooming in spikes and globular hanging fruits.



Cannonball Tree (ana-āam) A definite eye catcher, the cannonball fruit grow en masse from stalks surrounding the trunk of the large tree.



Jambolan Plum (n5n) An evergreen tropical tree in the flowering plant family Myrtaceae. Jambolan fruits have a sweet or slightly acidic flavor.



Pride of India (Sunūs)
The pride of India is widely cultivated in warmer climates around the world for its long flowering period in summer, its attractive autumn foliage, and its good drought-tolerance.



Pine Tree (Num) Casuarina is a tree that evokes sun and the sea has more merits than its beauty, commonly known as ironwood or horsetail casuarina.
